Every quilt has a story. Some stories are humorous. Some represent an event in a family or community history. And some betoken new stories yet to be told. Sharing stories about our quilts helps to connect and enrich all of us.

The McCormick County Quilt Trail is dedicated to help you discover quilt panels located within the County. Each panel is designed from an existing quilt that has an historical or emotional connection to the sponsoring family or organization.

Quilt-inspired designs are painted on wood panels, then sealed for weather-proofing. The panels are most often mounted on buildings or residences.

The colorful results are public displays that honor specific people, historical events, places and organizations, art and cultures. The designs captivate people of all ages, from all walks of life.



Follow the trail and learn about the people who lived here in the past and those who now call it home.

The McCormick County Quilt Trail project was conceived in 2011 and is part of the Upstate Heritage Quilt Trail. It is sponsored by McCormick County Visitors Council to promote tourism by visually enhancing the environment, rewarding both visitors and residents alike.

The Quilt Trail originated in Ohio in 2000 as a way to honor a quilting grandmother. The concept grew quickly and a network of Quilt Trails has expanded nationwide.

"Around the World" is the McCormick County Quilt Trail's first panel. It is located at the McCormick County Arts Council at the Keturah. The actual quilt is on display inside the MACK.



The "Rooster" panel at the Red Rooster Emporium is a new, original design. The Emporium is the Quilt Trail Headquarters and workshop. Visitors are welcome.



The Historic Train Depot is home to SC Wild's Heritage Center of Plantation Quilts. Come inside for a hands-on experiential museum.



At the library you will see "Grandma's Flower Garden" honoring decades of service of former librarian, Dianne Scruggs Purdy.

Willington History Center and Bookstore



About 12 miles northwest of downtown McCormick you will discover the Quilt Trail panel on the outside of the History Center building. Inside there are vintage quilts that date back to the Civil War.
